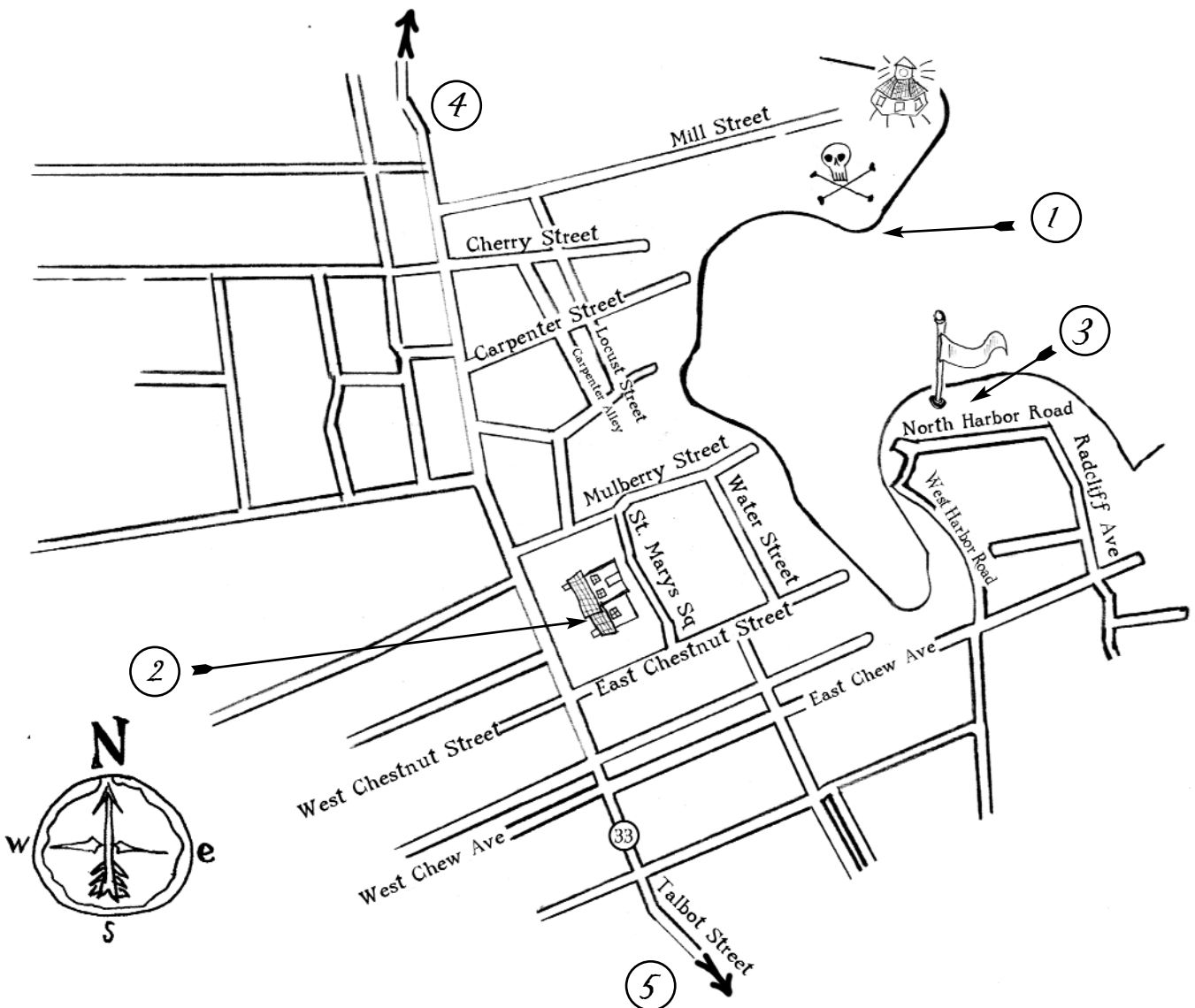


YE OLDE PIRATE MAP

Here be the most important places in town (though we do not list the places to find a nice grog, we expect ye can find them yourself).

1. X marks the spot! The Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum, also known as Pirate Central. This is where the wedding will be held. It's also a dandy place to visit before the event.
2. The Conners' house, also known as the Admiral's Quarters (or commonly as 404 Saint Mary's Square). This is where the happy couple are staying, where many decorations will be made the day before, and where the rehearsal dinner will be held Saturday night.
3. The Harbor Inn.
4. The Inn at Perry Cabin, on your right from Talbot Street after the Museum.
5. The St. Michael's Motor Inn. This will be on your left as you approach St. Michael's.



YE OLDE DIRECTIONS

Arr! If ye landlubbers want to get to St. Michael's from:

Far Far Away, then ye should fly into the Washington, DC area. Flying into Washington National (DCA, more recently named for a late president we prefer not to name) is what we recommend. There's also Baltimore Washington International (BWI), or Dulles (IAD). Rent a car and drive from:

Washington DC, then drive east along Route 50 (ye can get there from the Beltway) over the Bay Bridge. When ye see signs for the Easton Parkway, bear to the right. At a stoplight, turn right onto Route 33. You've but nine miles to go now to St. Michael's and the road will put you right on Talbot Street.

New York City, ye can either fly into DC and rent a car, or ye can drive from New York (we suggest Mapquest's directions and allowing about five hours).

The schedule is as follows:

Late Wednesday October 27th: The happy couple arrive in town. They can be reached at 410-745-2648.

Saturday, October 30: All day long, the happy couple will be crafting decorations. There are a number of other activities around town...see the web site for more details. A crab feast in the back yard commences at 6pm for the rehearsal dinner. All are invited.

Sunday, October 31st: At 4pm, the wedding begins on the dock outside the Steamboat Building at the Maritime Museum. The reception begins in the Steamboat Building as soon as the Cardinal is done with the ceremony.

It's on Halloween, so yes, you're expected to wear a costume for the wedding itself and the reception. Dressing up as a wedding guest doesn't count (and neither does dressing up as friend or family of the bride or groom...no loopholes). Kids are welcome...we're pretty sure of attendance of both babies and pre-teens. And yes, we'll have large quantities of candy to make up for any missed trick-or-treating.

There be many choices for yer stay in St. Michaels. Following are but a few:

The **St. Michaels Harbour Inn & Marina** is the most popular choice for guests. It's price is right in the middle. From there, the wedding is a water taxi or nice walk away.
